TRUE RESPONDER I was busy at work one cold

February day when I received a call from Lifeline Canada. I was a responder for a neighbor, and I was told he had a fall and they asked me if I could check up on him. This neighbor lives alone in the country without close contacts but wears a mobile On the Go personal help button so he would always have access to help.

I arrived at his home 10 minutes later and he was laying on the dirt floor of his basement. He had fallen while trying to turn his furnace back on and he could not get up on his own. I pressed his Lifeline button to advise the Lifeline Response Centre that this was a real emergency and that we needed an ambulance. They assured me that help was on their way.

Soon EMS arrived, assessed him, and helped him up. Since that incident, this subscriber calls me the angel that saved his life, but I know that Lifeline had his back right from the beginning.



They approached the City of Ottawa with a proposal that the City provide the location, and the 3 ladies would run the art gallery. The City consented, and the art gallery has been running ever since.

Janice Hall is a painter who has been with the art gallery from the beginning. Although she was accepted into the gallery at that time for her watercolours, her current passion is oils, and she brought along three of her oil paintings that she created from fabulous photographs

Judy Miller is a textile artist, who likes to capture "a moment of time" with her work. She loves nature and has done "artist residencies" in such varied locations as Portugal, Gros Morne and Wales.

Karen Bell has traveled extensively, with and without her family, and she brought some beautiful photographs of Monet's garden, Sherlock Holmes' pub at night and wild ponies in Iceland to show us.
